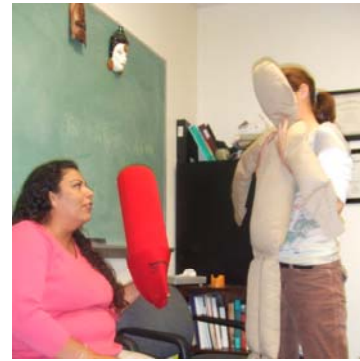
## Description of Program

The Masters program (MA) is housed in the Department of Counseling and Educational Psychology in the College of Education at New Mexico State University.

The Masters program is accredited in Mental Health Counseling by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP).

The MA Counseling Program is a 60 hour program with dual licensure opportunities in mental health and school counseling.

Training is tailored for service delivery in both mental health agencies and school counseling settings.



## Course Work

Students may complete the program on a full, three-quarter, or half- time basis.

All entering students must declare at the time of their application their intention to pursue full, three-quarter, or half-time study.

Courses are offered in **Block Schedule**. This means that students proceed through the program and take coursework with the specific group of applicants with whom they entered the program.

The MA program maintains low faculty-student ratios, particularly in courses where individual and small-group supervision is offered.
