TOTAL CREDITS IN SPANISH:

30-35 HOURS (minimum of 30)

A language assessment is required for all students entering the Spanish program, including native speakers. Native speakers may take SPAN *113, 213, and 214* (Spanish for native speakers) instead of the SPAN 111, 112, 211, 212 sequence. (Native speaker courses are listed in italics for identification purposes). Students with previous Spanish experience also may be placed beyond the beginning levels, according to the results of their Spanish language assessment. Elective credits in Spanish will be substituted to make a minimum of 30 credits.

Completion of the Spanish Teaching Field is conducive to completing a 2nd major in Spanish through the College of Arts & Sciences. For details contact the Department of Language & Linguistics in Breland Hall, rm. 220, 646-3408.

Department of Languages & Linguistics requirements for double majors:

Students can double major in Foreign Languages by completing an option in Spanish while completing a different major in another department. The double major must be completed prior to or simultaneously with the Foreign Languages major. Students who double major in Foreign Languages with an option in Spanish are not required to take **LING 200G** or a second language.

MINIMUM UPPER DIVISION REQUIRED (300+) **48**

The College of Education requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 for graduation and a minimum grade of “C” in all education, TEP pre-requisite and teaching field courses.
