Application Fee

A non-refundable check, money order, or credit card authorization in the amount of **\$30.00**, payable to **NMSU**, must accompany your application. Applications cannot be accepted without appropriate fee.

Application for Admission to Graduate School

The **Application for Admission to Graduate School** and application fee should be included in your CD Graduate Program Application Portfolio.

NOTE: Please disregard the instructions on the Application Checklist that are included with the Application for Admission to Graduate School. Send all materials to the address listed below. This will ensure that your materials will be complete and filed appropriately.

Transcripts

Two official transcripts from each college and graduate school attended as a registered student, including summer school, night school, courses abroad, etc., should be submitted with your CD Graduate Program Application Portfolio.

GRE Scores

An **official copy of the GRE scores** must be sent to the Graduate School. An **unofficial copy** must be included in the CD Graduate Program Application Portfolio.

Résumé

Content of the **résumé** should address such areas as: educational background, work experience, campus activities, volunteer experiences, special abilities/skills and other information that would help convince the committee of your commitment to the field of Communication Disorders and the program at **New Mexico State University**.

Letters of Reference (3)

Submit the **3 Letters of Reference** provided in the CD Graduate Program Application Packet. At least two of the three letters must be from professors in your major.

Personal Statement

Address your one-to two-page **Personal Statement** to: **CD Graduate Program Admissions Committee**. The content of the letter should address how you became interested in speech-language pathology; your personal motives for applying to our program; aspects of the profession that you find intriguing; critical consciousness of ethnic, disability, age, gender, and socioeconomic diversity; campus activities, volunteer experiences, and other information that would help convince the review committee of your commitment to the field of speech-language pathology.
