The College of Education (COE) at New Mexico State University (NMSU) has developed a licensure program in educational administration for persons who hold at least a master's degree, but have not completed a traditional educational administration preparation program. In order to qualify for the Licensure Program in Educational Administration at NMSU, **a candidate must have a contract with a district as an administrator.**

New Mexico State Department of Education Level III Teaching License
Employment as an administrator with a Substandard (waiver) license
Admission to NMSU Graduate School and Educational Management & Development (EMD) Department
